THOUGHTS FROM FATHER HARRIS

This bulletin covers June 11, the feast of The Holy Trinity and June 18, The Body and Blood of Christ.

On this Feast of the Holy Trinity, John's Gospel Proclaims God's plan as infinitely loving: "God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:17) We believe that God is three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. How that works I have no clue but it does. The closest analogy is this: A woman is a daughter to her mother, a mother to her daughter and a wife to her husband. It is the same woman but three different relationships. All I know is that for me I realize when I pray to this "Triune God" it works. I personally feel connected to God and when I take the time to pray and really listen and reflect on God, things happen in my life. I feel more at peace, there is direction in what I need to do next.

With the Feast of The Body and Blood of Christ, at the Last Supper Jesus gave us His Body and Blood (Bread and Wine) to feed us on our journey. When we come to Mass, we have to stop what we are doing (work, play, family, friends) and come to the Lord's table. We are fed in two ways: from the Liturgy of the Word (the Bible) and the Liturgy of the Eucharist (The Body and Blood). Just as when we eat healthy food we become healthy. When we are open to hearing what the Word of God has to say and are aware that we are receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus in Communion, we change. Christ lives in us and the person right next to us--be it family or friends.

Our annual National Concern Collection (June 17 & 18, 2017) provides funding for five Catholic initiatives that touch the faithful of Wisconsin as well as throughout the United States. Your generosity and prayers support the following appeals:

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development, working via the Diocesan Department of Stewardship and Development, provides national grants that make a difference in low income communities to fund programs addressing the very root causes of poverty. The Diocese recently received a \$20,000 technical assistance grant for the Ashland Area Development Corporation. The awarded funding will be used to develop a business plan that will lay the groundwork for a viable cooperative business structure for childcare centers in Ashland County.

The Catholic Communication Campaign focuses on finding new ways to deliver the gospel message to people in today's digital age - on the Internet to strengthen marriage, in podcasts for daily readings, on television for Christmas Mass, and on Facebook for sharing of the faith. Fifty percent of the collection supports local communications efforts. This past year our 15 Catholic Schools each received \$1,000 to help fund local marketing programs.

The Catholic University of America, located in Washington, D.C., offers students an excellent education in a faith filled atmosphere that is grounded in the Catholic intellectual tradition.

The Archdiocese for the Military Services is a newly funded initiative to grant support for this Church ministry that provides for the spiritual, sacramental and pastoral care of almost two million Catholics serving in the armed forces.

The National Retirement Fund for Religious maintains vital funding for our sisters and all religious institutes in need. Today many senior religious continue to manifest God's love and generosity by serving in a wide range of volunteer activities.

Again this year I ask that you consider giving what you can and to pray for a vibrant Church.
