THOUGHTS FROM FATHER HARRIS

After more than three months of Lent and Easter, we return today to Sundays in Ordinary Time. We will seen the "green" color in Church.

The Sunday of June 25 is the Twelfth Sunday of the church year. In the gospel, Matthew 10:26-33, Jesus is telling us "Fear no one. Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, or secret that will not be known." A woman's husband died suddenly while on vacation and she had to tell her ten year old son and seven year old daughter that their father had died. It was a horrible experience. But the mother asked friends to record memories of their father along with the children's own memories. They are shared at moments when her children are feeling low as well as happy. In doing so they are facing the fear of their dad's death. Over my years as a pastor I am able to hear and share of the stories of people who have struggled with many painful as well as joyful life experiences. What got them through them was their belief that God was always with them.

The Sunday of July 2 is the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The gospel is Matthew 10:38 "[Jesus said,] "Whoever does not take up his cross and follow in my steps is not fit to be my disciple."

A scene in the film American Anthem shows a young man who can't accept the fact that he lost a leg in an accident. He draws the blinds of his room, lets nobody in, and passes his time in darkness, listening to music. Contrast this scene with another scene reported by Robert Bruce. Walking along a crowded street, Bruce heard someone singing joyfully. When he located the source, he couldn't believe his eyes. It was a legless man, pushing himself along in a wheelchair. One person's rejection of a cross brought sadness; the other's acceptance of it brought joy. What is one cross in my life that I am finding hard to accept?

I thank God for my handicaps, for through them, I have found myself, my work, and my God. Helen Keller [from VISION, Mark Link, S.J.]


Come Cheer on the St. Bridget Softball Team!


