THOUGHTS FROM FATHER HARRIS

Fr. Jim Brinkman is covering our next two weekend Masses while I am on vacation. Fr. Jim was an associate pastor at St. Bridget's during the time the church was being built. Please give him a warm welcome.

This weekend of July 23 is the 16th Week in Ordinary Time. Jesus said, "An enemy sowed weeds in a farmer's field. When the farmer saw the weeds growing amid the wheat, he told his workers, 'Let the two plants grow together until harvest. Then I will tell the harvest workers to pull up the weeds...and burn them, and then to gather in the wheat and put it in my barn." Matthew 13:20.

The wheat stands for good people; the weeds stand for evil people. Jesus' parable reminds me that I should not be disturbed to find "weeds" growing in the "wheat" in Jesus' Church. What is/should be my attitude toward the "weeds" growing amid the wheat in Jesus' Christ?

Be patient with the Church. It is a community of weak and imperfect individuals. Put yourself at the disposal of the Church... The Church needs you.... You are the future of the Church. (Pope John Paul, Il speaking to the youth of Switzerland)

The Serenity Prayer says: God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change. Courage to change the things I can and the wisdom to know the difference. This is a familiar popular prayer which helps us to deal with things we cannot change.
