THOUGHTS FROM FATHER HARRIS

I had a wonderful vacation and was able to visit friends and catchup with my two god daughters, lots of walking, sleep and exercising filled my days. I am refreshed and glad to be back at our churches.

This bulletin covers the weekends of August 6, the Feast of the Transfiguration and August 13, the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time where Jesus tells Peter to walk on water which didn't turn out too good for Peter.

The Feast of the Transfiguration gives the disciples an experience of who Jesus is as the Son of God. "[Jesus] was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." Matthew 17:1-9 What is or are your mountain top experiences that are sacred and give you deep insight into what God and life is all about? The birth of a child, marriage, divorce, death of a loved one, graduation from high school, college or technical college, finally retiring after many years of work, feeling forgiven after a terrible sin—all of these are sacred moments that call us to the sacredness of life and God's presence with us.

The 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time has Matthew 14:22-33 "When [Peter] saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, 'Lord save me!' Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, 'O you of little faith, why did you doubt?'" The reason why Peter began to sink while he was doing the impossible is that he had taken his focus off of Jesus. A nurse returned from a month-long stint serving as a volunteer in a mobile in Haiti. Once back home, she asked to meet with her parish's pastoral council. She talked excitedly about her trip and passionately about the needs of the Haitian people. She showed pictures of the people she met and served—including a small church where the clinic had set up "Do you think we could adopt the church?" she proposed. Everyone thought it was a wonderful thing to do but the parish's budget was already tight, numbers were down, and what did any of them know about Haiti? But three members of the council offered to work with her to see what they could do. And before long, the little Haitian mission became their sister parish, bringing a new sense of meaning and fulfillment to both communities. Why did you doubt? As Jesus said. Fr. Jerry Harris

Scrip News

It's been another great year for the Scrip program! We received \$43,767.65 in total rebates for the various designation areas. In addition to providing financial support to church debt retirement, school tuition and tuition assistance, faith formation, youth ministry, and the school endowment fund, the scrip program has provided funding for several unbudgeted/unplanned parish items: a hot water heater for the rectory, weed trimer for the darkening window film above the cemetery, projection screen, vacuum cleaner for school, elevator kick panels, hearing assisted devices, wireless microphone for the sanctuary, and a lockable media cart for the upper youth room. We are truly blessed!

Thanks to all of our volunteers who keep the Scrip program running smoothly and all who use scrip to provide this extra revenue for our parish. A special thanks to Steve and Patsy Linehan and Ed Whitman for the countless hours of service they have provided as the Scrip coordinators for many years. Unfortunately for us, Ed has announced that he will be stepping down from his role. If you are interested in being part of this wonderful ministry and have a few hours each week to dedicate to the program, please step forward. Ed is willing to train!

We are currently in the process of updating everyone's scrip information to make sure we have the right information on file. Please watch for an email and reply as needed. 
PARISH LIFE (CONTINUED)
