From the pastor....

This bulletin covers the weekends of May 24, the Feast of the Ascension and May 31, the Feast of Pentecost.

The Feast of the Ascension is where Jesus "ascends to heaven." He is returning to God the Father. Bishop Barron speaks on this Feast: "The Ascension is Jesus' journey, not to another place, but to another dimension. But this dimension to which he has gone is not alien to us. It is instead a source of inspiration, power, and direction. And this is why the angels who appear to the disciples just after Jesus' departure say, 'Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?' What they are hinting at, none too subtly, is this: under the influence of Jesus' spirit, get to work! Do all that you can to foster the marriage of heaven and earth! Get on with the mission of the church!" (From wordonfire.org) I have seen a lot of people "get to work" during the pandemic. They "got it right!"

The Feast of Pentecost is the beginning or birthday of the church. It is the day when a scared group of disciples locked in a room was enveloped by the Holy Spirit. They were no longer scared and now bold about preaching the gospel. The Holy Spirit enabled them to spread the faith. We have the same faith today. In one of the prayers of the Sacrament of Confirmation ritual, we ask the Holy Spirit for the "seven gifts of the Spirit." It reads:

"Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide. Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence. Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence. We ask this through Christ our Lord."

And everybody said, "AMEN!"

We can receive the Holy Spirit and acknowledge the Spirits presence every day. All we have to do is ask in prayer.

Memorial Day Mass

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic there will be no Masses at the cemeteries. We have arranged to have Mass on WEVR Radio 106.3 FM at 9:00 a.m. on Memorial Day for both St. Bridget and St. Mary's for your listening. You can listen at home or in your car if you plan to visit a cemetery at the same time as the Radio Mass.

Memorial Day brings many memories to my mind. Growing up our family visited the graves of our loved ones. It was a powerful reminder of their place in our lives and a somber reminder of death. It was always a day of hope for me. The grave is not the end but one day we will rejoin them in heaven. We always honor those men and women who served our country and those who died in the military service. We are here because of their sacrifices and the grace of God. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord. Let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.

Greetings and God's peace during this pandemic. May 20, 2020

I am writing about the opportunity to receive Holy Communion until Mass returns.

The bishops of the State of Wisconsin have come up with a plan to allow small groups of Catholics to gather in church to receive the Eucharist or Holy Communion. It is based on the following statement:

"It is proper that those who are prevented from being present at the community's celebration should be refreshed with the Eucharist. In this way they may realize that they are united not only with the Lord's sacrifice but also with the community itself and are supported by the love of their brothers and sisters."

(Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass, no. 14.)

Beginning this weekend and continuing until further notice, Holy Communion will be distributed here at St. Bridget on Sunday afternoons, from 12:00-6:00pm. (Click <u>HERE</u> to sign up for a time slot.) If you know someone who does not use the internet but wishes to receive Holy Communion, please perform an act of charity and sign them up on line, or if you prefer, you may also call the church at 715-425-1870 to schedule a time slot for Holy Communion.

This is the procedure we will use for receiving Communion:

- -You will arrive at church at your appointed time. (You may have to wait in your car if you arrive early).
- -You will be greeted and welcomed by an usher or greeter at the church doors who will explain the process.
- -Up to eight (8) people maximum will be allowed to enter the church through the main doors. Examples of these eight (8) might be one family group of 8, or a family of four (4) along with another family of (3) and a single person, for a total of eight (8) people.
- -There are hand sanitizer stations inside the entrance of the church that you will use before entering the church.
- -You will then be invited to enter the church and walk forward to where the priest is standing by the altar, always maintaining social distancing. The floor will be clearly marked. The priest will be wearing a mask.
- -The priest will lead you through the brief prayer service and you will receive Holy Communion.
- -When the priest prays a final prayer, you will leave the church through a separate door than from where you entered to maintain social distancing. No one will be allowed to come early to pray or stay afterwards to pray because of the limit of 10 currently in place.
- -Multiple time slots for groups of eight (8) people will be scheduled back-to-back continuously during the Eucharistic sessions.

This procedure may seem cumbersome, but we want to make sure we take every precaution to prevent the spread of COVID19; the primary goal is that you will be able to receive the Eucharist with these precautions.

We want all people to wear masks if possible when entering the church and remove them or lower them to receive Communion. If you are not feeling well, please DO NOT come to the church. Special times will be available for those that cannot physically enter the church.


