What are some "loads" or "crosses" I have had to carry in my lifetime? Did any of these turn into a blessing? (VISION 2000, Mark Link, S.J.)


July 12, the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time.


Knights of Columbus Rosary Devotions

An adoption fund has been instituted by Fr. Dennis Mullen, a retired diocesan priest from Rice Lake. It began with the local Knights of Columbus, and provides grants to families who have been accepted to adopt a child. The families may use the grant money to help with expenses related to preparing their home for the adopted child. Providing support for adoption is a way to express that, as Fr. Mullen says, "We're a pro-life people...If Roe vs. Wade is reversed, the Catholic Church better step up for adoption...It ought to step up right now." 


