

From Father Rich...

"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men."

"In Matthew's Gospel Jesus leaves Nazareth for Capernaum to fulfill the promise of bringing light to the Jordan. He preached that the Kingdom of God requires reform. Indeed, it does. So, it was for the church of Peter and Paul. So, it is for us today.

In the 'always reforming' life of the church, at least two principles seem important. First, every one of us, from pope to pauper, from theologian to activist, from grandparent to child, stands humbly before God as a sinner called to conversion and salvation in Jesus Christ. There can be no other ground or principle from which we can approach our various gifts or deficiencies.

Second, it is good to recall the kinds of people Jesus chose for his Apostles and disciples: from the fishermen brothers Simon and Andrew to Matthew and John, to all the men and women accompanying Jesus throughout his ministry, they were all flawed yet graced. They would go on to heal and preach a kingdom that would draw millions to Christ. And what always helped them overcome their differences was the sure knowledge that it was in Christ's name they were fishing, not their own."


Welcome Bishop Powers!

Gala 2020 Tickets



- Provide a superior educational program that emphasizes social responsibility, stewardship, and respect for the world in which we live.









DID YOU KNOW...

- † Jesus Christ is our inspiration, our model and our leader.
- † Many St. Bridget graduates earn recognition as honor students at the high school level.
- † Our full-day PreK program for 4- and 5-year-olds offers educational opportunities for our youngest learners at a tuition cost of only \$106 per week, or \$22 per day or \$3.10 per hour!
- † Grades K-8 Tuition: \$3100 per year or just under \$18 per day.
- † Tuition assistance is available for students in Grades K-8.
- † \$500 credit toward Kindergarten tuition if a current PreK student continues at St. Bridget School.
- † \$500 credit toward Grade 6 tuition if a current Grade 5 student continues at St. Bridget School.
- † PreK class sizes of 12 or less and Kindergarten classes of 16 or less students allow individualized instruction, permitting teachers to be aware of each child's strengths and needs.
- † Maximum class sizes of 22 students in Grades 1-8 promote the opportunity for differentiated instruction in order to meet the needs of all students within the class.
- † Spirit Family activities encourage multi-age interactions and opportunities for leadership development, role modeling, community service, prayer, and fellowship.
- † Middle School concept utilized for Grades 5-8, encouraging age appropriate development during the early adolescent years in a caring, faith based environment.
- † Middle School students are eligible to participate in Band, as well as sports & clubs at MMS.
- † St. Bridget follows the same school calendar as the RF Schools, as well as utilizing district busing.
