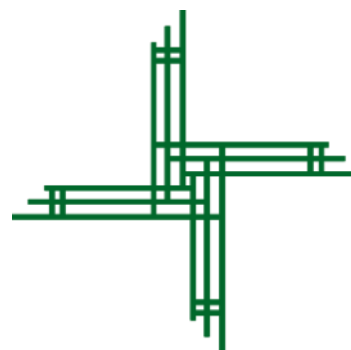

A Move from Maintenance to Mission – What does this mean?

Last May, Bishop Powers sent to each home in the Diocese of Superior a Pastoral Letter on Evangelization titled: “As the Father has sent me so I have sent you.” He writes, “Many of us have heard parishioners of a certain age reminisce with the yearning to return to the ‘good old days’ when the churches were full on Sunday mornings, and they always were bustling with activity. We find ourselves wondering ‘what happened?’.” For the last year, Diocesan leaders, clergy, parish staffs and parish councils have been reading and discussing the document put out to us by our Bishop and sent to all households registered in the diocese of Superior. [Pastoral Letter on Evangelization - Web Version.pdf \(ecatholic.com\)](#) More recently, members from our cluster community gathered with members from the Southwest Deanery to which there are twenty-three parishes/clusters, bringing together the hopes and challenges we face to move our parishes from just maintaining, to vibrantly living out the mission of the Church. For this meeting, Diocesan and Deanery leaders presented us with four very pointed questions and criteria to prayerfully discern. For this bulletin I would like to share with you the first question we are asked to consider.

Question 1 - Imagine that your parish/cluster suddenly lost all record of when Masses (daily and Sunday) are offered. What Mass schedule would be the ideal to best meet the mission of evangelization and discipleship for your parish(es)?

Some criteria and key questions to consider:

- Principle - 80% capacity is the ideal. This number is considered by many to be the ideal percentage of occupancy for a worship space. If the space is less full than that, there is a deflating sense for those there and visitors will feel a sense of low-energy and disengagement. If the space is fuller than that, visitors will have a hard time finding a seat and perceive the space to be inhospitable for them.

What percentage of your church is full at the various Masses offered (this may vary by season)?

What is the tone like when your parish/cluster comes together for special occasions (like the Easter Triduum)?

- Principle - The primary aim of the Mass is the worship due to Almighty God. Thus, it is appropriate that we fill all the roles within the liturgy with reverence and excellence.

How many Masses can your parish/cluster provide musicians, cantors, lectors, and altar servers for who can fittingly carry out those roles?

- Canon Law – Priests are canonically allowed to celebrate 3 Masses per weekend. Bear in mind that priests are often asked to perform wedding and funeral Masses on weekends as well (Canon Law 905.2).

o in your parish/cluster, how can you schedule your Masses to meet the canonical norms?

- Principle – All good ministry is relational ministry.

o How could you schedule your Masses so that your priest, the spiritual father of your community, can participate in important parish/cluster gatherings before/after Masses?

o Please note, priests and deacons your thoughts on these questions are important.

What exactly could this mean for our cluster community?

Currently we have two priests and three deacons serving our parish cluster, but with aging clergy and limited entries into the vocation of priesthood and the diaconate, we know this will change. In reviewing the criteria to be considered and noting the reality of empty pews contrasting the joy that is felt when worshipping in a filled church, we are considering a trial change in our Mass times. One of the options would be to reduce Sunday Mass times to 9:30 a.m. only with Saturday Mass time remaining the same. St. Mary's in Hammond is also in discussion. Currently, because we have two priests, this will be manageable, but if changes were to be made, Mass times would have to be adjusted within the cluster and we would be asked to make sacrifices. Please pray and know that any decisions made come from much discussion and prayer. The mission of the Church has always been to direct the faithful toward Jesus and each of us, by virtue of our Baptism, are called to be a missionary disciple. As missionary disciples we are called to risk the safety and comfort of our own lives to witness to the many things Jesus had done for us. Also, missionary discipleship calls us to take personal action when we see a need. We are called to step up and step out in faith and share the love and compassion of Jesus, within the mission of the Church; and this will look different for each of us. I will leave you with a thought from Bishop Powers' document, Pastoral letter on Evangelization: “It is quite simply that our diocese become a diocese of apostles. Like the first apostles, we need to rally close to each other in genuine Christian community. Like the first apostles we need to be animated by the Holy Spirit. Like the first apostles we need to depend utterly on the provision of God especially in and through the Holy Eucharist. May Mary and St. Augustine, our patron of the diocese, St. Bridget, and all the saints and angels intercede for us.” Amen.

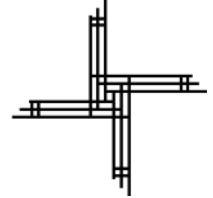
