In 1962, Mother Teresa set out in search of a place to begin *Nirmala Shishu Bhavan*, a home for abandoned infants. On her journey to Andheri, her vehicle unexpectedly broke down outside St. Francis Xavier's Church in Vile Parle. What seemed like an in-

terruption became an invitation of grace. There she met the parish priest, Fr. Paul Cordeiro, who, inspired by faith, offered her the rectory extension for this new mission. When Mother Teresa asked him, "Father, how will you manage?" his simple and profound reply was, "God will provide."

With that faith, Mother Teresa and her sisters began their ministry on September 15, 1964. She started with almost nothing—only three saris and a five-rupee note—but she possessed what mattered most: complete trust in God, a generous heart, and an unwavering belief that the work was God's work and the poor were the Lord's poor.

Providence is God's loving care that invites us to trust Him fully. As we begin this New Year, may we place our lives, plans, and uncertainties into God's hands. When we give ourselves totally to Him, He works through us in ways we could never imagine.

In the words of Mother Teresa: "Put yourself completely under the influence of Jesus, so that He may think His thoughts with your mind and do His work through your hands."

May this New Year be one of deep faith, generous love, and confident trust that, whatever lies ahead, God will provide. Wishing you a grace-filled and blessed New Year 2026.

Also, the IRS requires individuals who have reached the age of 72 or, in some cases, 73 to take a minimum distribution from their IRA or 401K. If you do not need these funds, consider donating them to St. Bridget because you can deduct the donation, which doesn't count as income. Before making any transfers, it's always a good idea to consult your financial advisor.

Drive. What an amazing accomplishment and a powerful lesson in service and generosity!


Now, Christmas break is here, and our students have earned a well-deserved time to rest and celebrate with their loved ones—while remembering the true reason for the season.

game! The cheer team will be there to support them, and all we need is **YOU** to come cheer, celebrate, and try out our new bleachers!





RECLAIMING SUNDAYS

The theme for January for Reclaiming Sundays is: **Invitation & Prayer.**

"The joy of the gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus." -*Pope Francis*.

The Archdiocese of St. Paul & Minneapolis has put together some sample activities we can implement within our families for the month of January.

Sample Activities for January:

- -"Invite someone outside of your family to share an aspect of your "reclaimed Sunday" (e.g., invite a neighbor for dinner, ask family friends to go on a walk with you)."
- "Liturgical Living: Intentionally celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. (E.g., light candles and have a little procession to place the Magi in your Nativity scene, use blessed chalk to bless your doorways, eat a meal of middle Eastern food, sing "We Three Kings," etc.) Invite someone to share your celebration."
- "Liturgical Living: Celebrate the Baptism of the Lord by remembering your own family baptisms. Light your candles, look at photos and videos from the sacramental celebration, invite godparents to share your celebration, bless each other with holy water, pray for your godparents, pray for priests who baptized you all, etc. While you have all these mementos out, document your family's baptism dates and mark them on your calendar to celebrate in years to come."
- "Recommended resource to assist in building habits of prayer is the Hallow App."
