The young man gave them all the money he had and left with the assurance that God still speaks to human beings today.

Listening is one of the greatest secrets of entering into the temple of God. To listen mans to forget yourself completely – only then you can listen. When you listen attentively to somebody, you forget yourself. If you cannot forget yourself, you never listen. Every time we listen to the voice of God; he tells us that he is dwelling with us and speaking to us.



- +Clearly print your name, phone number and the person(s) to be remembered with the memorial. Donations can be mailed in or put in the drop box at the front entrance.





This can be prayed anytime but best if prayed during the 3:00 p.m. hour when Jesus died for our sins. If you are unable to pray the Chaplet at that time then just take a moment to remember His Divine Mercy.


