Feast of St. Brigid: Patroness of St. Bridget Parish & School




Saint Brigid by Patrick Joseph Tuohy

The patroness of St. Bridget Parish is St. Brigid of Kildare. St. Brigid was born in **451** in Ireland and was born to a Christian slave and a pagan chieftain. Inspired by St. Patrick, Brigid became a Christian like her mother. This proved to be a problem for Brigid as her father did not understand her and tried to sell her to the King of Leinster. While the two were speaking, Brigid gave away her father's sword to a man in need. The King recognized Brigid's generous nature and commanded her father to leave her alone so she could practice her Christian faith.

St. Brigid went on to live in Kildare, Ireland where she built 2 monasteries.

Traditionally, the **February 1st** was celebrated in Ireland as the first day of spring.

At church on the weekend of **January 31st and February 1st** to commemorate this feast day, we will have a special *Reflection of Symbols* procession. We will also have children's bulletins, coloring sheets and fact sheets available at our Information Desk and printable versions on our website if you would like to learn more about our patroness.



The logo for St. Bridget Church and School, is the St. Brigid Rush Cross. Legend has it that St. Brigid helped a dying man become Christian after she wove him this type of cross out of rushes!


