

From the pastor...

Jesus said, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were greater sinners than all outer Galileans? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!" Luke 13:1-9

We are all the same people in the world. Many countries like Syria or Haiti suffer for centuries of injustice and misery. Others suffer due to natural disasters. Is it because God is punishing them? No, God doesn't work that way. Jesus addresses the audience: "If you do not repent, you will perish in the same way." We are not mice in a laboratory where God suspects and surprises sinners to punish them or rewards the good with nice things. Every person is admonished to change her or his way of thinking and respond to God's grace. Jesus pointed the finger when he warned, "If you do not repent, you will all perish like they did." What is a Mass intention? What is a stipend?

From the very beginning of the Church, it has been customary for the faithful to offer gifts of bread and wine for the celebration of the Mass. Throughout the centuries, this developed into a monetary donation instead of bread and wine. Monies given in excess of the cost of actual bread and wine for the Mass were then applied to assist the poor and eventually the clergy.

Thus, it became customary for the priest to accept from the faithful a donation (formally called a "stipend") in return for remembering a specific intention in the celebration of a Mass. In our Diocese, the stipends are paid to the parish and applied to the pastor's wages.

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for loved ones, living or deceased, is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition.



ABOUT THE DONUT MINISTRY

Parishioners who are early rises gather to make donuts at the church on Sunday mornings during the school year. Teams of parishioners also help to sell and serve donuts to other parishioners on Sunday mornings after Mass.

Teams are on a rotating basis for both selling and making donuts. Each team is scheduled 5-6 times during September through May. You will be put onto a team with experienced makers and sellers to help guide and train to making, frosting, selling and serving donuts.

Maker Team is generally about a 3-4 hour commitment of time.

Seller Team prepares coffee fellowship and serves donuts after the 9:30 and 11:00 Mass and includes clean-up. This generally is about a 3 1/2 hour commitment.

This is a great family ministry!

WHAT JIM WANTED TO SHARE

I began making St. Bridget's Sunday donuts in the 1980's when I joined Frank and Marie Deja and their family. We worked in the current church kitchen while the Deja family had been involved in donut making years before the basement of the old church.

The attraction to Sunday AM donut making for me is the people on the donut team. Having fun with people you now and enjoy minimizes your early morning efforts at 3:00 or 4:00 AM. You are trained to do certain steps in the donut making process. It is not difficult and you task with the spirit of your energetic co-workers.

The head of the donut team monitors the quantity of the donut types and keeps track of donut orders from outside parishes and groups.

Another group of parishioners will come in later to sell the donuts after Sunday Masses.

The donut team members enjoy working together and performing a task that benefits the entire parish.

St. Bridget Solar Panel Project



From Father Harris

For the past three+ years, I have been working with the Solar Array Committee to determine the feasibility of installing solar panels on the roof of St. Bridget Church. This committee was able to secure several grants and received one large donation towards the project. The committee has worked with the Finance and Parish Pastoral Council to address several concerns. Of major concern was the age of the current roof, the impact on the warranty, and trying to predict its life expectancy. After thorough research, it was determined that the panels would be attached using a ballasted racking system and would not impact the current roof warranty. Unfortunately, we have no way to know if the current roof will last 3 more years, 10 more years or 20 more years. The good news is the committee was able to secure additional donated funds to safely move the panels when roof replacement is eventually needed.

Last week both the Finance Council and Parish Pastoral Council voted to approve a motion allowing the Solar Committee to **accept pledges** for the sponsorship of **148 panels at \$550 each** – with the stipulation that all funds must be pledged by **May 15, 2019**, or the project would not proceed. The Solar Committee also was advised that no parish operating dollars would be used for this project, and that since the parish is focusing on a decrease in contributions, this campaign needed to concentrate on reaching out to those people who specify an interest in participating and who can comfortably indicate that this donation will not impact their regular giving to the parish.

As pastor, I support the goal of finding alternative energy resources while caring for our world as outlined in the encyclical Laudato Si by Pope Francis; I respect the advice of the two councils and have agreed for the Solar Array Committee to pursue pledges for this project with the deadline mentioned above.



In 2015, Pope Francis challenged each of us to consider how we are shaping the future of our home planet. Acting on his message, St. Bridget Church investigated ways to do our part in caring for our common home in our beloved parish of St. Bridget. A parish committee, headed by Tony Jilek, studied the feasibility of installing a solar array on the church's roof to generate a portion of the electricity for our parish building.
