The following was written by a Venezuelan family who fled legally to America because of death threats to them and are seeking asylum. Fr. Harris

Venezuela, a country located in South America, with its capital as Caracas, is rich in mineral, oil, and very splendid people. It has sea, rivers, snow desert, plains. For 20 years it has been deteriorating little by little. Now it is completely in chaos. People are suffering from corruption, which has stolen everyone's future. It is now a country in which millions of children do not have anything to eat, many eat from the garbage. Hospitals do not have money to assist and you die because there isn't even enough needle syringes. Newborns are put in card board boxes. The purchasing power is zero since a professional only gets \$5 per month.

We live in an unprecedented humanitarian crisis. The exodus of Venezuelans is by sea, air and land. To date there are more than 4 million who have left.

At this moment you will wonder why they have not taken out that government. Judges and prosecutors are against the people. If they capture you they invent charges. They have false witnesses and they send you to prison and spend years in jail without having a trial.

I tell you the government of Venezuela is tyranny. They are advised by Cuba and protect in the country many terrorist groups in the world. The men and women who have dared to raise the flag of freedom at this time are dead or are political prisoners in Venezuela. There are more than 1,000 political prisoners. Hundreds of young people have been killed for going out to protest. The military forces, the police are responsible for silencing a town without weapons. Venezuela inflation is 500 % annually. We live moments of anguish of much pain, once a prosperous country, with false socialism now only in death and desolation. All Venezuelans are affected but the most affected are children who have left school due to lack of school supplies and not having food


LABYRINTH COMPLETED!



ABOUT THE CONFIRMATION SMALL GROUP LEADER MINISTRY...

Confirmation Small Group Leaders accompany a group of about 8 students in 10th or 11th grade each week in discussion and provided learning activities. Along with a co-leader, their role is to provide a welcoming atmosphere in which group members feel comfortable to share their thoughts, opinions, and questions.

There is a catechist in-service in September which includes prayer, discussion of a faith topic, catechists getting to know each other, and a look at the materials and the year ahead. We have a second catechist meeting in December to again pray together and share the joys and challenges that we are experiencing in our classes/small groups.

The time commitment for being a Confirmation Small Group leader is about 1.5 to 2 hours per week. Small group leaders do not have to plan their own lessons, but simply read the provided outline ahead of time. They are asked to arrive by 6:15 p.m. to pick up their outline and other materials and greet their small group members at 6:30 p.m. Then they are asked to clean up their own small group table at 7:30 p.m. after the students leave.

the adults that were catechists for our old daughter 3 years before that when she went through the Confirmation process.

We enjoy getting to spend time with a great group of high schoolers. We love their energy and gift of the Holy Spirit. Before we started, we were a little concerned about being able to adequately share our faith and help in the preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation. However, it has been amazing to be able to connect with the youth of our parish. They have taught us just as much as they have learned throughout this process! Each week, we have been able to dig deeper into our faith as the kids share their differing perspectives.
