New Envelopes Coming Soon

Those of you who receive contribution envelopes through OSV should notice a change in the design of our envelopes beginning with the October mailing. The envelopes have changed from the "standard design" to specially created St. Bridget envelopes with color pictures representing our church and three focal points of our mission. This service was provided at no extra charge through the envelope company and the design was created by our very talented Meg Andrea.

Solar Energy Panels for the Church

In his encyclical letter of 2015, "Laudato Si: On Care of Our Common Home," Pope Francis appealed to every person on earth to become engaged in dialogue and questioning about how we are shaping the future of our home planet. Francis called on the Church to acknowledge the urgency of our environmental challenges and to join him with candor and humility on a new path in hope and resolve about our common future on earth. We take Francis' message to heart and have begun to seek ways to do our part in caring for our common home in our own beloved parish of St. Bridget.


To that end, a committee of parishioners, Tom Westerhaus, Bill Hansen, Gary Senn, Jerry Waller, and Alan Symicek headed by Tony Jilek and Fr. Harris, has been studying the feasibility of installing a solar array to generate a portion of the electricity for our parish buildings. The committee includes representatives from both the facilities committee and parish council.

The Committee presented at the September parish council meeting and recommended that St. Bridget consider installing a proposed 53.3 kWdc solar array, consisting of 148 solar panels, to be installed on the church roof. This system would generate approximately 40% of the power consumed by the church building. Grants in the amount of \$64,882 and a gift of \$25,000 for a total of \$89,882 have been secured to help fund the project. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$164,000. The remaining funds would need to be raised through a campaign in which parishioners would have the opportunity to invest in the purchase of a solar panel. This would take place late in 2018 and early 2019 to assure we could utilize the grant money available. Parish operating funds will not be used.

Pope Francis said, "The Creator never abandons us; He never repents of having created us. Humanity still has the ability to work together in building our common home." That's a powerful message for us here in River Falls, Wisconsin, as we work in 2018 and beyond to care for the earth and to serve those amongst us most in need. We believe the solar project for St. Bridget is an important part of listening to Pope Francis and caring for God's creation, and we seek the parish support in this important endeavor.


